



Great Words

Everyone loves listening to a great orator. Everyone appreciates an orator's ability to captivate and inspire audiences with powerful and motivational speeches.

Great speeches create a

sense of purpose and continuity. Successful orators recognise that great truths can be remembered best by one small quote. Keeping things short and succinct will make one's words more memorable than a great big rambling speech. Then of course it takes a big personality to put the weight of truth and integrity behind his or her words.

When Jesus is invited to stand up and preach back at his own hometown synagogue he chooses his reading with care. What Jesus chooses to read is to be a statement about his own mission priorities. He chooses to speak of social injustice. "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me," he reads, "... because he has anointed me to proclaim glad tidings to the poor, liberty to captives, sight to the blind, freedom to the oppressed." Then Jesus points to himself as the fulfilment of the ancient prophecy before handing back the scroll and sitting down. Jesus has obeyed all the rules of public speaking, he has considered the purpose of his reading, chosen words that will best convey his purpose, and delivered them powerfully and succinctly. How will Jesus' listeners respond to his claim? Today's reading doesn't give us the listeners' response so we have time to imagine what our own response would have been. Would we have been inspired and motivated to hear Jesus speak these words? Would we suddenly see the ancient prophecy as just that, an ancient prophecy, or as mission to be fulfilled under Jesus' exciting new leadership? Can we hear the poetry of these words resonating two thousand years later?

young her father wished to make a very suitable marriage for her but she insisted in consecrating her life to God. She received the

veil and spiritual formation probably from St. Mel and stayed for a period under his direction in Ardagh. Others followed her example and this led her to found a double monastery in Kildare

with the assistance of Bishop Conleth. She died in 524. The St. Brigid's Cross was used by Brigid to explain the Christian faith. Along with Saints Conleth and Lazarian, Brigid is Patron of

our Diocese of Kildare and Leighlin.





God's Promises Fulfilled

People make promises every day. Sometimes we give something to another person as a sign of our promise, sometimes we sign our name to seal our promise, other times we just give our word to another person that we will do something.

I'm sure you know what a wedding ring looks like? When a man and woman get married, they usually make promises to one another. They say something like, "I promise to love you for

better or worse, for richer or poorer, in sickness and in health as long as we both shall live." Then they exchange rings as a symbol of that promise.

You are too young to have a credit card, but one day you probably will. Most adults have a credit card which they use to buy things. When you buy something using your credit card, you have to sign a ticket. When you sign the ticket, you are promising that you will pay for the items you purchased using the credit card. Your signature is your promise.

People make promises every day. Do they always keep their promises? Unfortunately, some people don't. God makes promises too. The Bible is full of God's promises. Does God always keep his promises? Yes he does! One of my favourite verses in the Bible is one that says, "For no matter how many promises God has made, they are 'Yes' in Christ. (2 Cor. 1:20) That is what our Gospel teaches us today.

Jesus was in the city of Nazareth on the Sabbath day so he did what he always did on the Sabbath. He went to the synagogue. He stood up and began to read the words of the prophet Isaiah from the Scripture. He read where it says, "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, for he has anointed me to bring Good News to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim that captives will be released, that the blind will see, that the oppressed will be set free, and that the time of the Lord a favour has come."

When he had finished reading, he sat down. All eyes were on Jesus. Then he began to speak to them. "The Scripture that you have just heard read has been fulfilled this very day!" Jesus came to earth to fulfill the promises of God. All of God's promises are fulfilled in him.

Wouldn't it be great if you and I were as faithful in keeping our promises to God as he is in keeping his promises to us?

St. Brigid - Saturday 1st February

Born: 453 Died:523

St. Brigid is the Patron Saint of Ireland and of the Diocese of Kildare and Leighlin. A few years after St. Patrick arrived, a little girl named Brigid was born at Faughart, County Louth, in Ireland. Her father was an Irish Lord named Dubtach and her mother was a Christian slave named Brocca. As Brigid grew up, her love for Jesus grew deep. She once heard St. Patrick preach and never forgot his teaching for the rest of her life. She looked for Jesus in the poor and often brought food and clothing to them. One day she gave away a whole pail of milk and then she began to worry about

what her mother would say. She prayed to the Lord to make up for what she had given away. When she got home, her pail was full again. Another day Brigid gave away her fathers precious sword to a poor man so he could sell it to buy food. She was always helping the poor. Brigid's father wanted her to marry but Brigid had decided in her heart to give herself entirely to God. She did not want to marry anyone. Brigid finally got her wish and her father let her enter a convent.

Brigid became a nun under Saint Mel and shortly afterwards she founded a monastery on land given to her by the King of Leinster. The land was called Cill Dara (Kildare) or "The Church of the Oak".

Wouldn't it be great if you and I were as faithful in keeping our promises to God as he is in keeping his promises to us?

Time to Think! St. Brigid, a Woman of Hope

February marks a time of growth as the light of spring begins to overcome the winter darkness. The story and celebration of St. Brigid are deeply relevant today. Her tolerance, compassion, kindness, and inclusive spirit challenge the attitudes that divide us. Brigid symbolizes beauty, creativity, and hope. The traditional St. Brigid's Cross, woven in green, is a symbol of deep Christian hope, bringing life and freshness, especially as spring begins.

Imbolc, celebrated from February 1st to 2nd, marks the first stirrings of spring. After months of rest and hibernation, life begins to stir again. Spiritually, this is a time of new life coming into manifestation. Though we may see only small signs above the surface, things are moving in the darkness.

February is a month of hope, and St. Brigid's Day brings with it a story of compassion, generosity, healing, and renewal. Though it may still feel cold, brighter evenings, emerging green shoots, and snowdrops signal the arrival of spring. The darkness of winter is being transformed into the light of new beginnings. Spring is a season of hope and renewal, calling us out of darkness into God's light.

I love this time of year, embracing brighter evenings and early mornings. Snowdrops are emerging from the winter soil, and on February 1st, we celebrate St. Brigid of Kildare. Children in schools sing, "Saint Brigid brings the spring," and I pray that this season of hope will bring rejuvenation to us all.

Brigid was dedicated to helping those in need, living by the principle, "the measure you give will be the measure you get back." Born in the 5th century in Faughart, County Louth, she became a nun and founded the convent of Cill-Dara, now Kildare. She died there on February 1st, 525.

Her community served others through acts of mercy, and her oratory became a center of religion and learning. She founded two monastic institutions—one for men and one for women—and held jurisdiction over both. After the Norse raids in the 9th century, her relics were moved to Downpatrick, where they rest alongside those of St. Patrick and St. Columcille.

- St. Brigid remains dear to Irish hearts. Her name is still common, and hundreds of places are named in her honor.
- St. Brigid's Well in Faughart still attracts pilgrims today.
- St. Brigid's Day marked the beginning of the agricultural season, a time of ploughing, sowing, and blessing the work of hands. As we celebrate her legacy, may we ensure that the Creator is at the heart of all we do, living with kindness, compassion, and peace.

May St. Brigid continue to guide us with her light, hope, and spirit of renewal.






