The First Stone

It's a sad fact of life, if you do something good, it isn't remembered for very long. You are only as good as your last good deed. But if you do something bad, there will be those who insist on never forgetting it. There will always be those who mutter, "Oh that's 'so and so' the one who had the affair." "That Mr.

Thingymajig, the one who embezzled the company funds." It's a very sad human failing. We are loathe to let the failings of others go.

In today's gospel reading the Scribes and Pharisees brought a woman who had been caught committing adultery. According to the Law of Moses such a woman should be stoned. What has Jesus to say on the matter? As ever, The Scribes and Pharisees are seeking to trap Jesus into giving an answer that is unlawful. Jesus however is great at not falling into traps. "Let anyone among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone," he replies.

When we have made a mistake in life, the last thing we need is condemnation. Condemnation is rarely useful.

Condemnation sends us to a dark place where we fester. Denied our second chance, our self esteem is eroded. We begin to see ourselves in a different light. Other people think we are bad or weak so perhaps we are. Our self image spirals downwards, we start to behave the way people expect us to behave.... badly! But the people, who have pointed the finger of blame; are they really in any position to judge?

We are extraordinarily quick to throw the first stone. Our powers of empathy are limited. Perhaps we enjoy moral outrage. Perhaps we enjoy gossiping at someone else's expense. Today we are challenged. The next time we open our mouths to condemn, we are asked to find mercy instead, the same mercy we expect when we have fallen from grace.







Pointing Fingers—Throwing Stones

One day Jesus got up early and went to the temple. As often happened, a group of people gathered around Jesus and he sat down and began to teach them. As he was teaching, some teachers of the law brought a woman who had been living a sinful life and made her stand before Jesus. "Teacher," they said, "this woman was caught in a terrible act of sin. The law of Moses says that she should be punished by stoning. What do you say?" The Bible tells us that they were trying to trap Jesus into saying something against their laws so that they could bring charges against him.

Jesus bent down and began writing with his finger in the dirt. The men kept questioning Jesus trying to get him to say something. Finally, Jesus stood and said to them, "Whoever is without sin, let him be the first to throw a

stone at her," then he bent down and continued writing in the dirt. The men who had accused the woman looked at one another and walked away.

Jesus stood and spoke to the woman. "Where are your accusers? Did no one condemn you?" he asked.

"No one," the woman answered. "Neither do I. Go and sin no more."

Have you ever seen someone doing something wrong and you pointed an accusing finger at them? I think most of us would have to admit that we have. I had a pastor one time who was fond of saying, "Remember, when you point your finger at someone, there are three fingers pointing back at you." Try it, point your finger at someone and then look at your hand. Three fingers are pointing back at you!

That is the point of Jesus' teaching in our lesson today. Not one of us is perfect and we should remember that when we want to point fingers or throw stones at someone else. I have a small stone for each of you. Take it home and put it somewhere that you will see it when you think you might be tempted to point out someone else's faults.

What did we learn in today's Gospel? This is what I learned.

- Jesus teaches at the temple: Jesus was teaching people in a special place called the temple. It's like a big church
 where people go to learn about God and pray.
- A woman is brought to Jesus: Some people brought a lady to Jesus who had done something wrong. They wanted to see how Jesus would help her.
- The people wanted to trick Jesus: These people were trying to play a game with Jesus. They thought they could
 make Him say something wrong, but Jesus is very wise and kind.
- Jesus is gentle and caring: Instead of being mad at the lady, Jesus was very understanding and kind. He wanted her
 to learn from her mistake and become a better person.
- Jesus shows us how to forgive: Jesus forgave the lady and told her not to do the bad thing again. This teaches us
 that we should be forgiving and kind to others, even when they make mistakes.
- Jesus is a great teacher: Everyone who heard Jesus that day learned a lot from Him. They saw how He was wise, gentle, and kind, and wanted to be more like Him. We can learn from Jesus too and try our best to be good and kind to others.

This story from the Gospel teaches us to be kind, forgiving, and always try to learn from our mistakes.

Jesus is our loving teacher who shows us how to be better people and love one another.





Time to Think! Preparing for Holy Week

The month of April has begun with splendid sunshine and blue skies. This is a beautiful time of year, nature awakens within us all a time of hope and new beginning. Next week, we begin Holy Week, beginning on Sunday 13th, Palm Sunday. The past few weeks of lent have moved quickly by. These days, spiritually, we are invited to indulge in a wonderful promise that our God conquers darkness, transforming fear into hope, sadness into joy, anxiety into a deep confidence, that in Christ, all will be well.

There is no shortage of bad news, we live in a turbulent and troubled world. Our economy is exposed by U.S. tariffs, as being very vulnerable, despite huge progress in recent years. Images across the world of war, famine and devastation caused by natural disasters makes us all somewhat fragile. It is precisely in this context, at a particular moment of time, where Jesus in his final days, lived and

witnessed every aspect of human vulnerability.
Often people ask how God allows such bad things happen?. As we journey through life, our human experience teaches us words or answers, to the why of human suffering, are not found readily. Jesus, doesn't give an answer to the why of human suffering, but rather by his example offers each one of us a great sense of empathy as he himself carried the cross.

As we enter Holy Week, we walk with Jesus through the most sacred and challenging moments of His life. This is a time to pause, reflect, and open our hearts to the mystery of God's love. From Palm Sunday's triumphant entry to the silence of the tomb, we see a journey that mirrors our own-moments of joy, betrayal, suffering, and, ultimately, resurrection. So, this Holy Week, let's journey with Him. Let's serve like Him, endure with Him, wait with Him, and rise with Him. For in His passion, we find our salvation; in His rising, we find our joy. This Holy Week, Seven days, filled with Religious Symbolism and Rituals, from Washing Feet to Venerating the Cross. Holy Week tells the very hopeful story of Jesus' great love and resilient compassion. A free love, given in an absolute fashion. A love, told powerfully by a God who "lay down his life for his friends".

On Holy Thursday, we witness Jesus washing the disciples' feet, a radical act of humility. He shows us that love is not a feeling alone but a service, a giving of oneself. How often do we hesitate to serve, to forgive, to kneel before others in compassion? Jesus in Gethsemane reminds us that we are not alone. His fragile and very vulnerable experience of doubt, frustration and extreme anxiety is a powerful solidarity with so many who are uncertain and overwhelmed. I think especially of those who live with anxiety, ill health, bereavement and the horrible reality of war and violence especially Christians being persecuted across the world.

Good Friday confronts us with the cross—raw, real, and heavy with the weight of human suffering. Yet, it's not the end. Jesus' cry of abandonment becomes a cry of trust: "Into your hands, I commend my spirit." In our own crosses—our struggles, losses, or fears—can we trust that God is near, even when we feel forsaken?

The Prayer of Abandonment by Charles de Foucauld is a profound expression of trust and surrender to God's will. Charles de Foucauld (1858–1916), a French Catholic priest, hermit, and missionary, lived a life of simplicity and devotion, particularly among the Tuareg people in the Sahara Desert. Though he didn't formally compose this prayer as a standalone piece, it is derived from a meditation he wrote in 1896, reflecting his spirituality of self-abandonment—letting go of personal control and entrusting oneself entirely to divine providence.

The prayer is often presented as follows

"Father, I abandon myself into your hands; do with me what you will. Whatever you may do, I thank you: I am ready for all, I accept all. Let only your will be done in me, and in all your creatures—I wish no more than this, O Lord. Into your hands I commend my soul; I offer it to you with all the love of my heart, for I love you, Lord, and so need to give myself, to surrender myself into your hands, without reserve, and with boundless confidence, for you are my Father.

Then comes Holy Saturday, a day of waiting. The tomb is sealed, and silence reigns. It's a reminder that faith often means holding on in the dark, trusting that light is coming.

Finally, Easter dawns. The stone is rolled away, and death is defeated. This is our hope: that no darkness is final, no wound beyond healing. Christ's resurrection invites us to rise too—to new life, new purpose, new love. Holy Week is an invitation to pause, reflect and nourish our spiritual selves. In a secular world, Easter eggs have been on sale since last Christmas. Easter, is much more than chocolate and lamb. Holy Week is indeed seven very sacred days. I pray that the grace and love of God will accompany you throughout these special days.


